## STREAMLINED RESOLUTION OF REQUESTS RELATED TO ACTIONS BY THE UNIVERSAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATIVE COMPANY

CC Docket No. 02-6 WC Docket No. 21-93

Pursuant to our procedure for resolving requests for review, requests for waiver, and petitions for reconsideration of decisions related to actions taken by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) that are consistent with precedent (collectively, Requests), the Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) grants, dismisses, or denies the following Requests.<sup>1</sup> The deadline for filing petitions for reconsideration or applications for review concerning the disposition of any of these Requests is 30 days from the release date of this Public Notice.<sup>2</sup>

Although petitioners filed their FCC Form 486 more than 120 days after the last day to receive service, we find good cause to grant these appeals. The rationale for adopting the *Archdiocese of New Orleans Order* FCC Form 486 relief standard was to ensure that a late-filed FCC Form 486 would not dictate the deadline for E-rate invoices. *Id.* at 11750, para. 8. The Bureau noted that a failure to timely file an FCC Form 486 prevents USAC from issuing the relevant FCC Form 486 notification letter and therefore could frustrate the timely submission and payment of invoices, pursuant to the Commission's invoice rules. *Id.* at 11750, para. 10. In fact, the standard the Bureau created for relief was based on the invoice filing deadline to ensure that the invoicing process would not be delayed by tardy FCC Forms 486. *Id.* In the instant cases, petitioners' invoice filing deadlines have not yet occurred. We therefore grant these appeals because, in these instances, the late filing of the FCC Form 486 did not frustrate the timely submission and payment of invoices as the forms were filed before the invoice filing deadline.

Looking at the merits of the appeal, New World Educational Center's application should be remanded back to USAC for a re-examination of its discount calculation using the documentation it provided.
